The *World Bank e-Library* is an electronic portal to the World Bank's full-text collection of books, journals and other documents on social and economic development. It is the most comprehensive collection in the area and brings together a fully indexed and cross-searchable database of thousands of World Bank publications, as well as every new title as it becomes available in print.

In addition, subscribers have access to information not available in print. The *World Bank e-Library* is fully searchable by subject, region, keyword, title, author, abstract, or year of publication.

- Quick search by region and subject, or advanced search
- All publications on a given subject and region are cross-linked
- Live reference linking to external sources
- Complete metadata and MARC records
- TOC alerts
- RSS feeds
- COUNTER compliant usage statistics
- Bookmark feature for quick reference

Subscription Information

The World Bank grants unlimited access to the *World Bank e-Library* across subscribing institutions through IP authentication. We offer rolling subscriptions for 12 months, or subscriptions running January through December. Partial-year subscriptions are pro-rated based on the subscription date. To receive a price estimate, please specify:

- Academic libraries: total number of FTE (full time equivalent, i.e. students and faculty)
- Public libraries: total population served
- Corporations / other institutions: total number of authorized users (total number of users across the institution)

Individuals may purchase a subscription to the entire *e-Library* or to selected regional or subject-based collections, as well as individual titles.

Libraries subscribing to the *World Bank e-Library* have the option of adding the *e-Library Print Archive* to their subscription. This plan offers substantial savings on the list price of World Bank titles and allows libraries to offer both print and electronic collections at an affordable price. As a single-invoice subscription, it also allows libraries to budget more effectively and to reduce the time and costs associated with multiple invoices and blanket standing orders.
